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We offer compassionate, evidence-based care that positively changes lives.

Pregnant women impacted by substance use disorder often face stigma and fragmented care in systems that delay treatment and discourage engagement. Without timely, compassionate support, infants are more likely to experience severe symptoms of neonatal abstinence syndrome (NAS), resulting in longer hospital stays, increased medical complexity, and a higher risk of family separation and disrupted bonding at birth.

Hushabye Nursery is changing this trajectory by ensuring every baby and their parents receive the right care, at the right time, and in the right setting. Through integrated, family-centered services that begin in pregnancy and continue through birth and beyond, Hushabye improves health outcomes, strengthens parent-infant attachment, keeps families together, and helps build healthier futures for generations to come.

Reduced Length of Stay

Average NICU stay for NAS is

22 DAYS

with the current NICU standard of care

Average Hushabye Nursery stay is

7.7 DAYS
